- Evaluated national Seminar Camp invitation model
- Continued researching local and domestic program opportunities
- Re-evaluated costs associated with both domestic and international programming (travel insurance, extraordinary fees, etc.)

- Motioned to add an additional delegation to the Step Up program
- Created the DEIA Committee to address issues surrounding diversity, equity, inclusion and accessibility
- Increased efforts to collaborate with CISV International

- Successfully completed a "Peace Wave" campaign to promote awareness surrounding action for sustainable development
- Created and launched a CISV USA Book Club to encourage active participation and discussions surrounding current global issues

- Re-clarified Fortnight mission
